FROM WHERE I SIT OCTOBER 2019

My daughter, wife, and cousins treated themselves to a "Girls Weekend" at the Ritz-Carlton Hotel. I have never been there, but hearing about the way they



Tuesday PM: "Irresistible" study by Andy Stanley at 7pm through October 22nd. This is for men and women.







OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOE BOX GIFTS SEND GOOD NEWS AND GREAT JOY!

Operation Christmas Child (OCC), a missions project since 1993 of the relief organization Samaritan's Purse, provides shoe boxes each year to children around the world which are filled with fun toys, hygiene items, school supplies, etc. The shoe boxes are filled by church members nationwide and then delivered to children in need as a tangible way to demonstrate God's love and the Good News of Jesus Christ.

These gift-filled shoe boxes are shipped outside the U.S. to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine, and disease; and to U.S. children on Native American reservations. For many, the shoe box is the first gift they've ever received.

Blaine's 2019 missions project goal is to pack 272 boxes and offers two easy ways to pack an OCC box:

1. Pick up a box at church, pack with suggested items listed below (or see the list in the box). Use envelope in the box and follow directions to cover cost of postage - enclose \$9 cash or write a check to Samaritan's Purse.

(One idea - shop at Hobby Lobby in Traverse City, Mon-Sat, 9 am - 8 pm before November 9th. OCC signs are in various departments for stickers, toys, games, flip flops, bright colored t-shirts, school supplies, bandanas, plastic cups, cross stitch kits, etc. See their website: <https://newsroom.hobbylobby.com/articles/operation-christmas-child/>)

2. **NEW THIS YEAR:** Sponsor a box - donate \$25 (covers \$9 postage and \$16 to fill the box). Make check payable to "Blaine Christian Church" and a box will be packed for you in honor or in memory of someone you choose. Fill out a sponsor sheet, available at church, to include with your check. Our church's OCC volunteers will shop for items to fill your box, then turn in receipts and get reimbursed from sponsor's donations. Boxes will be packed at the packing party at church on Saturday, November 9th, between 4 - 6 pm.

A simple shoe box packed with gifts and love, and then fueled by prayer can have a huge impact - by demonstrating God's love to children around the world and bringing them the Good News of Jesus Christ.
