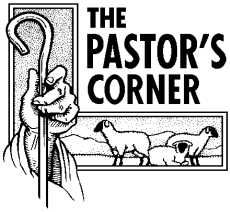

We are working on plans to reopen the office at minimum Mon, Wed and Friday starting June 15th. Please pray for us as we will need healthy volunteers to expand hours and serve more needs, especially in the areas of cleaning, donation pickups & delivery of Comforts of Home furniture to clients, Benzie Store personnel, MANNA Pantry, Benzie & Manistee Family Life Center teachers for classes & cooks, servers and cleaners for meals, and those with IT experience to help us as we create online class options.

Safe Harbor of Manistee, which normally closes at the end of March- right when COVID-19 was reaching our area. We remain open and expanded to meet the Stay Home order keeping the guests safe. We were able to remain open until June 1st. What a blessing!! Attached is a letter from our Family Service Director, Lisa Clarke, who directs our Safe Harbor ministry.

Safe Harbor 2019-2020

Just when the season was about to close, it became a need to find a way to secure those who could not “Shelter at Home”. We were able to stay open at The Tabernacle Church for the first 2 weeks. COVID brought stress and fear into the program. We called around to get pricing at local motels. We knew it would cost to keep our 7 remaining guests safe. Generous people stepped up to offer help. The blessing amazed me, but God, our Way Maker, was not done yet.

Just days before checking into the Riverside Motel, NMCAA contacted me and had money to keep our guests secured until the executive order was lifted; 3 meals a day, and cleaning supplies. The original plan for 2 weeks stretched into 9.

The last week, June 1 three guests remained. One planned to reconnect with his daughter, another found a room with a friend and the last one wanted to go down state – no buses. I found him walking, as I pulled away from the curb, a man came running up waving his arms. The man asked him if he needed work, if he had a place to sleep and if he was clean and sober (yes because of Safe Harbor). At the end of the conversation the guest had a job, a place to sleep and transportation the next night down state. That is the WAY Maker.

God doesn’t care about your color, income, or where you have been sleeping He loves the soul. He is certain to make a way in these uncertain times,
